### Year 11 Mock Examinations

I am writing to you about the two-week mock examination period that will begin for Year 11 pupils on Monday, 3 November and last until Friday, 14 November inclusive. The mock examinations will mostly take place in the main Sports Hall and Gym.

I will outline to Year 11 pupils in assembly the protocols for examinations in the Sports Hall but it is worth parents and pupils bearing in mind the following:

- Pupils should line up on the tennis courts 10 minutes before the scheduled examination. For morning examinations, it will be 8.45am, for afternoon examinations it will be 12.50pm.
- All afternoon examinations will commence at 1 o'clock (as in the real examinations) so pupils should expect some mocks to finish beyond the normal school day. Teachers of Period 4 lessons will allow pupils out of their classes early so that they can have a break before the examination starts
- Pupils should bring their own pens, pencils, rulers and mathematical equipment in a transparent plastic case
- No equipment will be handed out to pupils who do not bring their own equipment
- Pupils should not share any of their equipment with other pupils prior or during the examinations
- Pupils should ensure that mobile phones are not taken into the examination hall
- Pupils can bring bottles of water but all labels must have been taken off before entering the examination hall
- No food will be allowed in the examination hall

For information, the results of the mocks will be issued on 02 December 2025 in a results assembly.

There will also be a programme of revision workshops for certain subjects in the October half term holiday that your child may wish to benefit from. Attendance is not mandatory but you will understand that these sessions can only be beneficial to your child. Pupils will not have to wear uniform when attending and may bring snacks and drinks to help them work effectively. The sessions will run in the morning and afternoon. Please note that as these workshops are being offered outside of our normal term-time timetable, with only a small number of students and staff on site, there will not be our usual first aid arrangements in place.
